  - Description of any deviations from the form or from period practices, and why such deviations were made.
  - o All information needing citation is cited in a standard style that includes page numbers.
- <u>Sources and Bibliography</u>: Sources for the poem are specific to the form, period and literary techniques that inspired author's work, and include period examples. Sources also support the use of the subject and/or themes in this poetic form in the author's chosen period and place. A bibliography in a standard style is included.
